Burglary Suspect Also Had Drugs, Stolen Credit Cards

EDGEWOOD—A surveillance video at Fruitvale Elementary School played a big role in leading local law enforcement officers to the man and juvenile accused of breaking into the school last weekend.

When the suspects were found last Saturday, officers discovered much more than just the

school's stolen computer equipment. Various drugs and stolen credit cards from Louisiana also were recovered.

The quick solving of last Friday night's crime spree started with the video.

Edgewood Police Officer Robert Dearing said the video clearly shows a pickup truck driving into the front doors and breaking the glass to allow two men entry into the building.

He and Edgewood Officer Jackie Buccafurno later arrested a 16-year-old male juvenile and a man identified as Trenton Eugene Sinyard, 26, Waxahachie.

Dearing said Buccafurno was checking on the welfare of an Edgewood resident Saturday when she discovered a pickup matching the description of the one sought in the
